

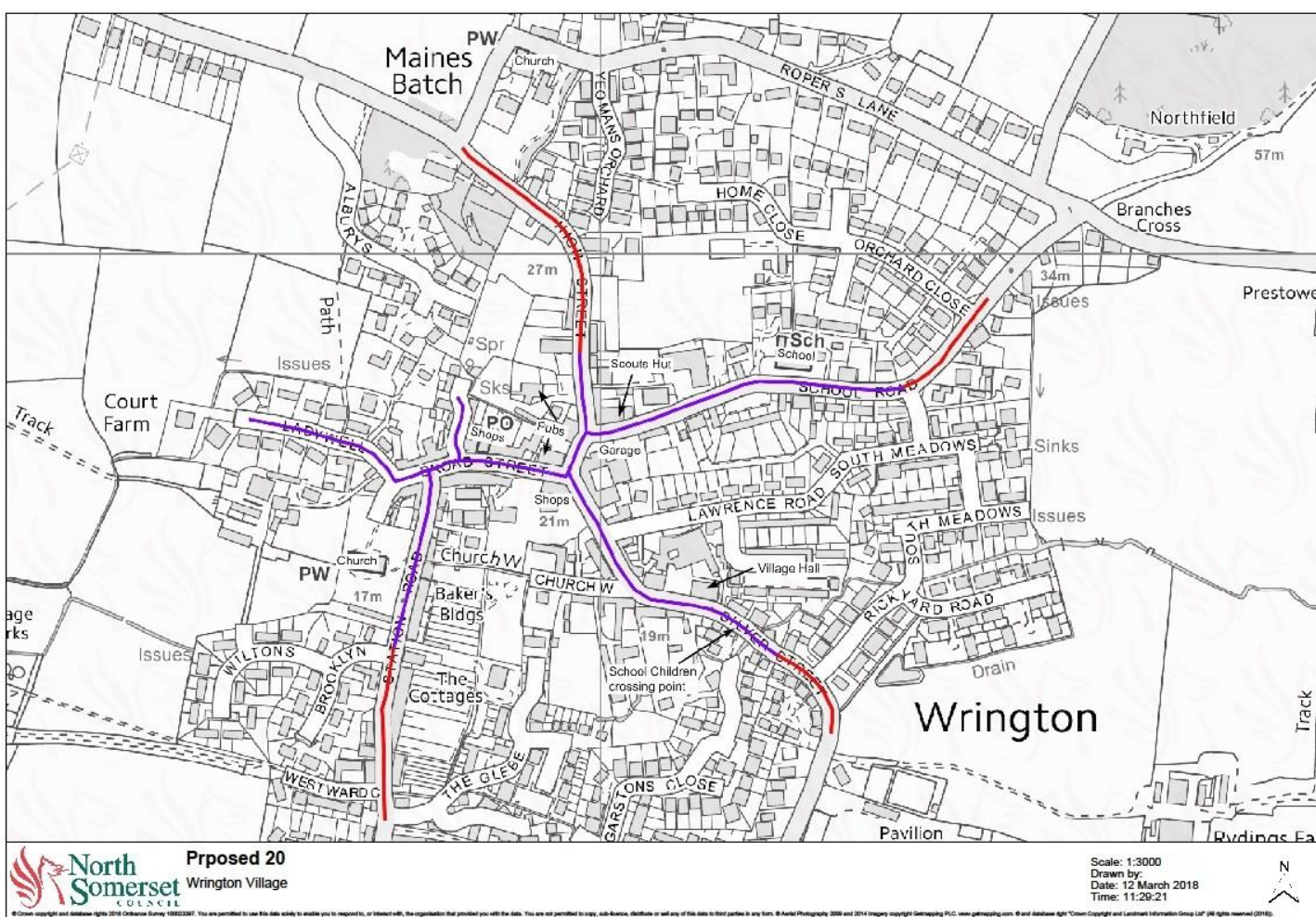
A 20mph speed limit in Wrington – a Petition!

Wrington Parish Council has proposed a 20mph limit to cover the roads through Wrington village in order to increase safety for residents. North Somerset Council agreed in principle, but only to a limited area. On the map below the red and purple lines together show the area proposed by Wrington PC. Unfortunately, so far NSC has only agreed to the more restricted area covered by the purple lines.

Wrington PC's much preferred scheme includes roads without pavements where pedestrians feel at risk when vehicles that pass them are travelling at up to 30mph. More of our residents would be encouraged to walk if speeds were generally lower and we feel it is vitally important that the extended area is included in the scheme. There's more information overleaf on Parish Council's proposed scheme.

The proposed 20mph speed limit extension proposals in more detail:

- * High St – the red line runs from the pump to the Chapel Hill junction. This stretch is steep, narrow, has no pavements and a blind bend. It is the route to and from Alburys, parts of Ropers Lane including the Chapel/URC and Yeomans Orchard.
- * School Rd – the red line runs from South Meadows to Orchard Close. It is steep, has no pavements and is near a bend. This is the route to and from Orchard Close, parts of Ropers Lane (& URC) and the Wrington School entrances on School Rd and Orchard Close.
- * Silver St – the red line runs round the bend at the Rickyard Rd junction. It has no pavements, a blind bend and is potentially hazardous at the bridge over the stream. It is the route to and from Garstons, Lawders Orchard, Rickyard Rd and Cox’s Green (with 59 more houses proposed) and the Recreation Field with pavilion, tennis courts and bowling green.
- * Station Rd – the red line runs from Brooklyn to The Glebe. It has no pavements past The Cottages. It is the route to and from Butts Batch, Kings Rd, Old Station Close, The Glebe, Westward Close, the dentist and the veterinary practice.
